STATEMENT BY ATTORNEY BILLY MARTIN

After nearly ten weeks of requesting Congressman Condit to provide any information that would assist in the investigation of the disappearance of Chandra Levy, Congressman Condit agreed to allow the Metropolitan Police Department to search his apartment and we believe that he has submitted a DNA sample. However, the Levy family believes Congressman Condit should continue the spirit of cooperation by agreeing to take a polygraph examination administered by the Metropolitan Police Department, or the FBI.

In his announcement today, again, through his attorney, he revealed that he had taken and passed a polygraph exam by an evaluator of his choice. Since we do not know what Congressman Condit has said in his interview with the Police, and since he refuses to meet with me or my investigators so that we can ask questions relating to his knowledge of Chandra prior to her disappearance, the family does not believe that Congressman Condit is fully cooperating with the family in their efforts to find their daughter.

Since neither the family, the Metropolitan Police Department nor the Federal Bureau of Investigation participated in the administration of Congressman Condit's private polygraph examination and since he made these private arrangements while we and the authorities were trying to reach an agreement on the questions to be asked during the polygraph examination, the Levy family feels that Congressman Condit's actions were not in the spirit of cooperating with the Levy family.

We regret that the congressman chose not to honor either the Metropolitan Police Department, or the Levy family's request. We continue to hope that Congressman Condit will cooperate fully with the investigation into the disappearance of Chandra Levy.
